

Graduate Council Resolution in support of a Reasonable and Moderate Extension for the Relocation of the Fire Service Management Program from the School of Information Systems and Applied Technologies to the School of Architecture

RATIONALE

Whereas, the College of Applied Sciences and Arts proposes to relocate the Fire Service Management program from the School of Information Systems and Applied Technologies to the School of Architecture; and

Whereas, the School of Architecture deals with building codes, building construction, sprinkler systems, etc., as part of building design; and

Whereas, the Fire Service Management program would be better aligned with the School of Architecture, facilitating collaboration between the two programs; and

Whereas, the relocation of the Fire Service Management program to the School of Architecture will not require any programmatic changes, changes in accreditation, or employment opportunities; and

Whereas, the relocation of the Fire Service Management program to the School of Architecture will only involve minimal cost in the form of updating of promotional material; and

Whereas, the relocation of the Fire Service Management program to the School of Architecture will not impact any other educational units, curricula, or degrees;
