Graduate Council Resolution in support of the RME to Reorganize the College of Education and Human Services into Five Administrative Units

WHEREAS the College of Education and Human Services (COEHS) has experienced large enrollment declines during the past few years; with the enrollment declines resulting in major budget cuts (\$1.2 million in FY 2013 and \$522,000 in FY2014) for the college, and

WHEREAS the COEHS has also experienced significant declines in the number of faculty in the last five years; and

WHEREAS in response, it is proposed that the COEHS be reorganized from eight to five units (i.e., schools, institutes, or departments); and

WHEREAS the proposed benefits of the reorganization include reduced course redundancies; administrative efficiencies and staffing consolidations which will allow for more synergy and opportunities for additional courses being offered and potential long-term enrollment increases; and

WHEREAS the proposal has been disseminated to the college as a whole, and discussions conducted within the college, and more specifically, among the affected units with the Dean having opportunities to address concerns/criticisms of the RME; and

WHEREAS the reorganization retains all graduate programs, tenure and nontenure track faculty lines, and proposes no resulting resource loss for the delivery of any program; and

WHEREAS the vote of faculty of the seven affected units resulted in a *simple majority* of the units approving the reorganization: 4 units approving and 3 units not approving, and

WHEREAS continued operation within the existing structure is likely to result in continued decline and further diminish resources for the college;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Graduate Council recommends approval of the RME to reorganize the College of Education and Human Services.
