Resolution in Support of Doctor of Education

Whereas the College of Education and Human Services is proposing the addition of a New Unit of Instruction for a Doctorate of Education; and

Whereas the EdD is intended to deliver a terminal degree reflecting a practice-focused education that emphasizes the application of research to improve accountability, functionality, and outcomes in educational organizations for students, families, communities, taxpayers, and other stakeholders; and

Whereas Projections call for an initial three-year period of two functioning cohorts of 15-18 parttime graduate students each, with additional cohorts admitting 10 new students each year.; and

Whereas the program would require a minimum of sixty approved credit hours of graduate courses, including 6 credits of doctoral seminars, 12 dissertation hours, 9 hours of research coursework, 3 hours of internship, and would require a preliminary examination and a capstone project directed by a chairperson who holds authorization to direct doctoral dissertations; and

Whereas the current budget, faculty lines, and staff is sufficient to offer the new program

Therefore, be it resolved that the Graduate Council approves the New Unit of Instruction for the addition of the Doctorate of Education in the College of Education and Human Services.
